Dear Carinya Families,

On Tuesday March 27th, Carinya Long Day Care centre will close at 2.00pm to support our educators to attend the Big Steps campaign rally in the Melbourne CBD. Parents will not be charged for the time that the centre is closed.

As we all know, these first years for our children are crucial for their development. And high quality early childhood education and care, provided by qualified and experienced Educators, gives them a fantastic start in education and in life.

We are sure you are also aware that those who work as Early Childhood Educators are among the lowest paid in the education sector earn well below the average Australian wage – for educating our children through their most formative years!

Over the last few years Early Childhood Educators nationally have been active in the Big Steps campaign, which aims to bridge the gap for pay and conditions in the Early Childhood Education sector as well as gaining professional recognition and respect for the vital work they do.

At Carinya, successive Committees of Management have been committed to improving the wages and working conditions of our educators, because we know that having highly qualified and experienced educators ensures the high-quality care and education that our children deserve.

Carinya is a signatory to the United Voice Union Agreement, which delivers the best pay and working conditions in the sector. Still, even a degree qualified Educator earns less than a *similarly qualified and experienced primary teacher*.

The long-term answer cannot be for parents to pay more. As parents ourselves, the committee knows that it is not possible for parents to continue to pay ever-increasing fees. The Early Childhood Education sector needs a better solution. It needs a commitment from our State and Federal Governments to properly fund and support Early Childhood Education in the same way it funds and supports school aged children.

Our Carinya Educators have asked the Committee and all parents to support them in their next campaign action. Tuesday March 27th is Keep your Kids at Home Day. Educators are asking parents to keep our children at home to support the campaign and allow them to attend the National Day of Action.

On Tuesday March 27th Carinya Long Day Care centre will close at 2.00pm to support educators to attend the rally for all Victorian educators in Federation Square in Melbourne.

All of us will need to pick up our children by 2.00pm on this day. Families will only be charged for half a day, as there will be no care provided after 2.00pm.

As parents, the Committee understands that this is not going to be convenient, but it is a core belief of the Castlemaine Childcare Co-operative that respecting and valuing our educators in their work will mean the best quality care for our children.

Educators are seeking parents support to stand with them in their campaign. The Big Steps campaign will provide buses on the day to transport Educators **and any families who would like to join them** to attend the rally in Melbourne CBD. These buses will be at the centre in Templeton Street at 1.30pm and will return to everyone to Castlemaine after the rally has finished.

Hi Everyone,

The children have now settled well into our room, at this stage of the year & seem to be feeling familiar with all our educators and their peers. The children are demonstrating they are becoming familiar with our routine and activities, more confident to engage in our different learning activities. This participation helps build confidence in their ability and develops a sense of belonging and contributing to their Kangaroo group.

We have noticed an increase in confidence & the volume of communication this month between the children & directed towards the educators. The children are engaging in enjoyable conversations exploring ideas and concepts and sometimes challenging ones thinking. We are continuing to learn about Emotions and how to deal with them appropriately to encourage more resilience and self-regulation within each child.

Supporting our children in developing a strong sense of wellbeing is one of our current goals; this includes helping children with the process of Toilet Training.

As children become more independent they can take greater responsibility of their own health, hygiene and personal care. A strong sense of wellbeing provides children with confidence and optimism which maximise their learning potential.

Wellbeing is connected to resilience, providing children with the capacity to cope with the day to day stress and challenges. If you & your child are ready for toilet training be sure to chat with us about your system or for advice so we can be working together in helping your child succeed in this important

developmental milestone. We have had success stories in our room already with toilet training this year; we are here to help you. Accidents are a normal (and usual) part of the process of mastering toileting, we all have to practice new skills to end up competent at what we are trying to achieve so please remember to pack lots of extra clothes including a spare pair of shoes & socks is a great idea.



At last the steam train is back in action, the children have been excited to participate in Wednesday excursions to platform 3 to watch the steam train arrive from Maldon! The Wednesday children have been talking about these excursions a lot, so we will endeavour to take small groups of children down to the station on other days for a visit, they will not see the steam train (as that's only on Wednesday) but the outing to view two regular trains pass each



other at the station will be an exciting excursion also. We have had our first excursion to the library this week with a small group, the children chose some books to enhance our learning & extend our knowledge on topics of interest at the moment, dinosaurs, colours, & Australian animals are just a few of our interests.

Pre-Kinder Wombat Room News from Heather, Sally and Carolyn.

It has been a lovely start to the year and we feel very lucky to have the opportunity to share and celebrate many of the children's achievements



both small and big. Each successful step is unique to each child, for example; venturing outside with confidence, climbing to the top of the A frame, mastering the pedals on the bikes and tractor, applying our own sunscreen, climbing up on top of the trapeze swing, manipulating and

sculpting with clay, constructing machines and creating wooden structures, as well as beginning to write their own name.

As we reflect on each child's wellbeing over the past term, we have become acutely aware of the many transitions children need to adjust to throughout their daily lives that involve different places, people and activities. For example, moving from their home

environment to the Carinya environment. Changes to the people they spend time with, such as from parents to educators, or from one educator to another and the peers that they engage in play and conversation with. Transitioning from one play experience to another, both inside and outside, as well as moving from play to group times and meal times. Anticipating these changes and making suitable preparations develops resilience and the appropriate skills to approach unexpected situations with confidence. As each child is developing skills at

different rates, some children require additional support to manage and adjust to these changes. Providing support and implementing suitable strategies to make these transitions more comfortable and purposeful is foremost in our minds when interacting with the children throughout the day. We have had some discussion with parents concerning these changes throughout the day. If you would like to discuss this further and the progress of each child, we would be more than happy to make ourselves available. Just reminding you that if you would like to catch up for a more detailed chat, there are meeting times available, a list is available on the wombat room. If the times do not suit you, please don't hesitate to suggest a more suitable time for you.

Echidna kindergarten room

We have almost reached the end of a busy term 1. It has been encouraging to see children becoming more settled within their environment, knowing where to find things and where to put them back, building their confidence regarding their relationships with other children and educators and developing their understanding and independence around routine tasks and daily activities.

Looking forward to term two we will be embedding three new programs:

Bush kinder (Monday only):

Due to begin on Monday April 16th. All families will receive their digital 'bush book' very soon which outlines dates, locations, maps etc. As you are probably already aware, we recently received notification of planned burn offs during autumn in the Kalimna Park location. Although the burn site is not where bush kinder operates, as a precaution we will **not use Kalimna Park during the autumn season**. Therefore, during the months of April and May any scheduled visits to Kalimna Park will now relocate to the Campbells Creek site (adjustments have been made to the calendar within your bush book). Kristy will get confirmation from DELWP that all planned burn offs in Kalimna Park are finished before our visits to that site are due to resume from June onwards.

Early Learning Languages Australia (ELLA):

ELLA is a digital language program for preschool children. The program is an Australian Government initiative where children learn language through applications ('apps'), called *The Polyglots*. The apps are used on tablet devices and have been specifically designed for preschool children. We anticipate a term 2 start. Fortunately we have received funding from the Department of Education and Training to help with the purchase of tablet devices and as soon as we have these we will get the program underway. The language we will be focussing on is **Spanish**

Letterland:

Letterland is a phonics-based approach to teaching reading, writing and spelling to 3-8 year olds that was first developed in the UK. The Letterland characters transform letter shapes into child-friendly pictograms that in an imaginary place called Letterland. Simple stories about the Letterland characters, explain the full range of dry phonics facts so that children are motivated to listen, to think and to learn. These stories explain letter sounds & shapes, allowing children over time to progress to word building, reading and writing.

Dear Families, 15 March 2018

Educators at Castlemaine Childcare Centre are involved in the *Big Steps* campaign - protesting the low wages and poor conditions of the early childhood sector.

The "Walk Off" action first began in 2015 in response to the inaction of the federal government to adequately fund early childhood education.

The Big Steps campaign, at its core, has always been about pressuring government to fund professional wages for educators and to address the issue of rising costs for parents.

Educators at Carinya want to communicate personally to you, our families, why we have made the decision to take part in the Big Steps rally on Tuesday 27 March.

Your child's Educators are dedicated to making a positive contribution to the lives of children and families in the critical early years.

The Committee of Management of Castlemaine Childcare, representative of the community of families, has placed great emphasis on quality Early Childhood Education and Care and the vital role of Educators in this service (as well as more broadly for all children and families) since its inception and this is evident in the respect and esteem in which Educators are held by parents, the continuing high levels of education of Educators and ongoing commitment to professional development, the low turnover of staff and the well-deserved reputation of Carinya within the Castlemaine and district community. We are rated as an **Exceeding** Service.

We are advocating for the right of all families to access affordable, high quality early childhood education services, regardless of their income. We have an opportunity through the *Big Steps* campaign to advocate on behalf of all Educators and especially for those who do not have a voice and are among the lowest paid *professionals* in Australia.

Early Childhood Education and Care (ECEC) is a sector predominantly employing women and is greatly affected by the gender pay gap. Average earnings are 30% lower for ECEC when compared with other sectors and especially to those that predominantly employ men with equivalent levels of qualifications.

Restructuring the early childhood sector would ensure proper funding and close the gender pay gap.

The Government is asked to commit to the vital work of Early Childhood Educators and education and to fund professional wages. We believe the government has an obligation to fund all levels of education.

Staff at Carinya have voted to participate in a "Walk-off" action calling for Equal Pay, at 2.00pm on Tuesday 27 March 2018.

We understand that closing early on Tuesday 27 March will cause some inconvenience for you and it is not a decision made lightly. This is a crucial issue and we appreciate the support provided by families to this action.


