**Gender Equity Workshop** - Organised by Communities for Children Bendigo, Educators from both long day care and family day care (and myself) attended this very interesting night. #### LDC IMPORTANT INFORMATION

KidsXap – Please use the app to check bookings, confirm bookings, update your address, bank details etc etc

Make sure you have an active MyGov account. Only you can confirm enrolments and changes and view subsides via this app.

#### LONG DAY CARE Centre

**2019 Enrolments** – Enrolment packs emailed today! Make sure there is an answer in every box and you will then have FULLY completed your child's enrolment form. Enrolment forms must be completed and returned ASAP and **before your child can start care in 2019**. Please attach your child's Immunisation Status Certificate – the new requirement is for this to be supplied every 6 months. If you require a new *Medical Action Plan* for your child, please email <u>carinya@castlemainechildcare.com.au</u> and forms will be sent to you. If you already have an *Action Plan* in place, as these must be updated every 12 months a new action plan will be required if it has not been updated in this previous 12 months. The updated *Risk Minimisation Plan for the Blanket Excursion Consent* form will also be emailed. Please read these documents and sign as required.

In the Kitchen – Welcome Emily our new Centre Cook while Becc Wade is on maternity leave. We also congratulate Becc and Thom on the safe arrival of Gordy. To those who have cooked in the interim, a big thank you! Sue and Cedella – centre educators, our Ed Leader Sarah Hart, Emily who juggled two shifts a week while managing her other job and to Alex Perry late of *The Good Table* who came and covered two

shifts. Thank you for your delicious contributions.

# **Committee of Management News**

#### **Big Steps Campaign**

Earlier this year, United Voice (the union for Educators) in conjunction with Jobs Australia, drew up the new Professional Childcare Standard Agreement for Educators to which Carinya has been a signatory for some years now. Committee agreed to continue to be a signatory and to pay Educators under this Agreement. Educators voted in November and the process is now closed. One of the best and most significantly different aspects of the Agreement – as opposed to the Children's Services Award - are the realistic hours allocated to Educators for the planning and implementation of the children's program. Of course, it is also significant for Educators to be paid better (though not yet in line with other work with similar educational levels) and valued properly through this Agreement. Thank you for your support of the actions this year.

Dear Carinya Families,

We are writing to you to inform you of an increase in the Long Day Care daily fee for next year. A new daily fee will be in place from start of the new year, Tuesday 15 January 2019. The Committee has set the annual fee increase to occur each January in the order of 4-5% each year.

Please be aware that if your child's days are changing from this year to next, you may need to confirm a new Complying Written Arrangement (through KidsXap) in January to ensure that your Child Care Subsidy is paid.

This increased daily fee together with the continued savings that we have implemented in the budget, will see our financial standing improve over this next 6 months and deliver a more robust financial position to the long day care service.

Carinya's education and care service is rated *Exceeding National Quality Standards*. The Educator and Staff cohort hold qualifications above what is required by regulations and the experience of all Staff and Educators combined spans many, many years in the sector.

Carinya celebrates 40 years of continuous service to this community in 2019 and responsibly positions itself financially to provide service for many years to come with quality programs that families value.

We are always looking for members of our community who can provide skills, services and volunteer time to supplement our costs or add value to the facilities and services we already offer. Please contact a member of the Committee of Management if you are interested in assisting in any way.

This last month has been an exciting time studying our fertile eggs daily for signs of life and watching the precious little chickens hatch out of that tiny egg. The children have been fascinated by the independence of the chickens, how quickly they grow and learn to take care of themselves without a mother to help!

We have had daily reminders from the children to feed and water and 'check' the chickens are doing well. This process has educated many children to the responsibility and duty of caring for a 'living creature'.

It has been a pleasure to see the children's independence, confidence and knowledge develop through the process of this egg-chicken process.

We have four chickens needing a home very soon! If you have suitable housing and would like one or more, please come and see any of the Kangaroo staff.

Another major focus of our program has been daily transition visits to the Wombat yard and room to familiarise the children with the staff, other children, play equipment and bathroom facilities they will encounter when promoted to the Wombat Room after the Christmas break. We now know the children's Educators will be Carolyn and Heather for next year, so we have been introducing the children to their new educators to promote the best possible smooth transition for your child to the Wombat Room.

Apart from the fun, creating decorations allow children to further develop fine motor skills, learn new skills and explore creativity and imagination and enjoy the satisfaction of crafting a masterpiece!
