EDUCATORS - FIT & PROPER PERSONS

POLICY

There are many ways of objectively assessing whether a person is fit and proper to provide a child care service. These could include police security checks, Working with Children Checks, contacting referees and interviews.

PROCEDURE

- 1. An Educator must be a fit and proper person to provide a child care service.
- 2. All adults (over 18 years) resident in the Family Day Care home must meet the fit and proper requirement for being around young children, ie by holding a current Working with Children Check and by undertaking a police check at the commencement of Family Day Care occurring in the home and at intervals determined by the scheme.
- 3. A person is fit and proper if:
 - the person is capable of providing an adequate standard of child care in the Family Day Care setting;
 - the person is of good character and is suitable to be entrusted with the care of children.
 - Can produce a clear police check and a Working with Children Check.
