EDUCATORS - HOME SAFETY

POLICY

All Educators' homes must undergo a Home Safety Assessment before being registered with the Mt Alexander Family Day Care Scheme.

The aims of the Home Safety Assessment are:

- To establish a level of safety for the house and property of an Educator which will provide a safe environment for children in their care.
- To enable potential hazards to be identified so that they can be controlled to reduce the risk of injury to children.

PROCEDURE

- A Home Safety Assessment is carried out after a prospective Educator has been notified of a successful interview.
- 2. Home Safety Assessments are carried out annually using the safety checklist developed by FDCV and Kidsafe (Child Accident prevention Foundation of Australia).
- 3. Educator must be notified of any hazards requiring further attention.
- 4. When recommended actions have been taken to rectify hazards, the prospective Educator should request a further Home Safety Assessment to ensure standards are now met.
- 5. Once the house and property of the prospective Educator has been deemed to have reached the required safety level, the selection process may continue.
- 6. A breach of any particular Safety Standard referred to in the Home Safety Assessment may lead to de-registration of the Family Day Care home.
