A few reminders for everyone!

Please remember to adhere to your booking agreement times

For LDC, educator to child ratios must be maintained at correct levels. When you bring your child in earlier than stated on your initial booking, we are caught without the required number of educators. Likewise, if your child is not collected at the time marked on your booking sheet. If you need to bring your child in earlier on occasion or make a more permanent change to your booking, please speak with Bec in the office.

For FDC, your booking agreement needs to be accurately maintained. If your booking agreement is an 8am start, then you cannot deliver your child any earlier than 8am and similarly at the end of the day, if your booking is a 5pm collection time, then you will need to be signing your child out no later than 5pm.

For both services: It is important to arrive around 10 minutes before your booked collection time to ensure the time is available to greet your child, hear about your child's day, gather their belongings, sign out and be leaving just before or right on the dot of your finish time.

If you want to have a longer conversation, it is best to make another time.

As educators are required to be supervising and interacting with children, pick up time is not always the best time for an extended conversation about your child and their development. Educators are happy to make time for telephone conversations or another time to meet and talk with you.

It also enables educators to finish for the day have their well-earned rest!

Children's Bags - Please keep a close check on what is in your child's bag. In both services, we find pieces of play equipment that make their way into bags and sometimes go home with the child. This is especially disappointing when it is puzzle pieces! Educators have also found and reported items such as money, lighters, medications (both child and adult), diamond rings and other jewellery. Please check morning and night what is hiding in your child's bag.

KidsXap – Please use the app to check bookings, confirm bookings, update your address, bank details etc etc

Make sure you have an active MyGov account. Only you can confirm enrolments and changes and view subsidies via this app.

Paying your account: Please remember how important it is to the provision of high-quality care for all children that your accounts are paid on time. **Centre-based long day care families** can set up direct debit arrangements through KidsXap. **Family Day Care families** can set up direct debits direct from their bank account to ours. Please remember we do not accept cash payments for either service.

Welcome to all our Families. We have had a great start to the year and children have made the transition from the Possum Room to becoming a Kangaroo with ease. Thank you all for your background information sheets. These are instrumental in learning a bit about your family life at this stage of the year and helping us to help your child settle.

We use this information in our interactions with the children and build on the goals you have as well as learning about each child's interests. Our initial goal is for children to become familiar with our routine and we encourage independence skills such as getting their photo, choosing a locker and becoming responsible for their own belongings such as hats, shoes and the use of individual hand towels.

Many children are on the cusp of toilet training which is an important milestone in their lives. Please speak to an educator if you feel your child is showing interest or almost ready so that we can encourage this and support what you are doing at home.

Our early programme covers many learning areas and as we observe children at play, we will plan for individual and group interests to be included in our programme. Our programme, as well as spontaneous experiences, are displayed on our information window.

We hope to start going on small excursions over the next few weeks. Our usual outings include the library, train station, hub garden and football oval. If you have not yet filled in a blanket excursion form, please see the office or room staff. We will start off with small group outings for children to become confident and competent whilst on excursions. We will have a lot of discussions about our expectations and road rules prior to going out, so children feel comfortable with this part of our program. Excursions are an important part of our programme and give us opportunities to learn about safely engaging in our community.

We are attempting to embrace the new KidsXap app and send weekly messages through this forum. Please download the app so you can access this information from us.

We welcome your input to our programme and especially encourage any parents who can contribute time to share their expertise with our group. We are always happy to have a chat about your child's learning journey.

Hi Wombat Families,


The first six weeks of the term have flown by so fast and the children have settled in well into their new environment. They are all demonstrating great confidence when engaging in play experiences with their peers and are very comfortably interacting with all the Educators. Anyone who has said goodbye through a few tears, it hasn't been long before they are happily engaged in an activity.

Establishing clear routines in the morning for the children creates a feeling of belonging within the group and a clear understanding of the day ahead of them and they can prepare themselves both mentally and physically. Chatting to your child as they are getting dressed and discussing what they may need to pack in their bag is an important part of the routine of the day. You may ask about the activities or play that they are looking forward to in the Wombat Room.

When arriving, assist your child to locate their name tag and choose a locker. Help your child to place their hat and drink in the correct location in the room as this all encourages your child to become aware of where their belongings are when they need them.



We have posters displayed on the lower half of the door as you enter and in the same position on the back of the door as you exit. These visual reminders will assist you and your child in these important beginning and end of day routines.



A discussion with your child about the activity you may do with them prior to you saying goodbye, can assist with a more harmonious transition into the day. Choosing an activity rather than specifying a time frame, is more easily understood at this stage of their development.

Everyone is having a lovely quiet rest after lunch. Each child has their own pillow with their name on it. We read stories, listen to music or enjoy a story being read to us. We give each child an option as to whether they would like a bed and/or blanket. During this time some children fall asleep. Please let us know in the morning if you feel that your child may need some extra assistance to fall asleep so that we may provide extra help.

Please remember to download the KidsXap, so you can receive current information, room updates and access your child's incident reports.

With a recent interest in birds we have created a play space with birds' nests and literature. This has been a popular and comfortable play space for many children.

Already this term we have acquired new skills as we have manipulated and managed new equipment and tools - for example - sticky tape dispensers, scissors and pasting with both 2 and 3 dimensional materials.

We recently had a visit from Kaitlyn (Frankie's Mum) in her professional role as a Paramedic. She brought along the Ambulance which provoked much discussion and learning. The developing ideas and role play that has continued in our Wombat Hospital has been invaluable. The children are increasing their knowledge as they care for others, developing an understanding of general health and well-being, as well as the opportunity to interact positively both verbally and non-verbally with their peers and educators.

We have been exploring the feeling of painting on different surfaces as well as activities that encourage us to develop both sides of the brain as our arms cross over the midline of our bodies. These activities have also assisted in increasing the strength and control in our shoulders, arms and hands.
